Hayley Caulfield, 20, is the Executive Assistant of Left Right Think-Tank, Australia's first independent and non-partisan think-tank of young minds.

Founded in early 2008, Left Right's mission is to empower all young people to make a contribution to public policy. Its vision is for an Australia that holds the values of equality, opportunity, sustainability, peace and security to be both self-evident and universal.

Hayley is currently studying a Bachelor of Arts at Monash University, while working part time as the Office Manager at a real estate agency on the Mornington Peninsula. She began employment with Pingiaro Partners First National Real Estate at the company's inception, assisting in the development and implementation of many of the current business procedures and practices.

During March 2005 she attended the United Nations Youth Conference, working on the development and advancement of international issues facing today's society and later attended the Young Leaders Conference in 2006 which focused on building critical leadership skills in a global context. Hayley has also attended a Christian leadership conference in Canberra focussing on politics and global change, and represented her secondary school in the Young Women in Public Affairs Award, through the Zonta International Organisation.

Hayley was a member of the senior debating team during secondary school, and was actively involved in the Student Representative Council. She has mentored junior students in the Flinders College peer support program in both 2004 and 2005 before serving as a Prefect in 2006.

Hayley is committed to the community and has worked with the CHIPS organization (Christians Helping in Primary Schools) through a Life Gets Better Camp run by volunteers supporting children aged between five and twelve years, who are dealing with major grief, such as a death in the family or to help them cope with the recent divorce of parents.

During the 2008 mid-year holidays Hayley hiked the Kokoda trail in Papua New Guinea with her secondary school and joined them on their annual mission trip to the village of Buna, in Oro Province, where they assisted in the development of formal education practices.
